

# **SOCIAL STUDIES**

Required courses for graduation:

- 1.
2. U.S. History
3. Civic Government

## **ADVANCED PLACEMENT GOVERNMENT**

CREDIT: 1

LENGTH: One year

LEVEL: Grade 11-12

PREREQUISITE: None

This course will examine the structure and purposes of government at the federal state, and local levels. Part of this will include an in depth study of the US Constitution. Civic responsibility of the citizenry will also be discussed. The pace and rigor of this class will be more demanding than the regular Government class. The expectation of the students is that they will take the Advance Placement Government Test at the end of the year.

## **CIVIC GOVERNMENT**

CREDIT: 1

LENGTH: One year

LEVEL: Grade 11

PREREQUISITE: None

This course will examine the structure and purposes of government at the federal state, and local levels. Part of this will include an in-depth study of the US Constitution. Civic responsibility of the citizenry will also be discussed.

## **U. S. HISTORY**

CREDIT: 1

LENGTH: One year

LEVEL: Grade 9

PREREQUISITE: None

This course will be a survey of the various historic periods of United States History from the Civil into Modern Era. Both foreign and domestic topics and their impact on the United States will be covered.

## **WORLD HISTORY/GEOGRAPHY**

CREDIT: 1

LENGTH: One year

LEVEL: Grades 10

PREREQUISITE: None

This course is a combination of World History and World Geography. The World History content will survey key historical eras and events of World History starting around 1900 and moving to current times.

World Geography will be studied by examining how the various aspects of geography have impacted worldwide historical events.

**WORLD HISTORY**

CREDIT: 1

LENGTH: One year

LEVEL: Grades 9 – 12

PREREQUISITE: None

This course consists of a survey of major events throughout the world from early civilization to modern times. This class meets one of three required social studies credits for graduation.
